Originally called Fernhill No. 1 barrow. A central pit was dug into this barrow about 1926. Some middle bronze age pottery was found. This was dried out by building a fire at the site. Tips of two antler picks were found. Probably the only ones ever found on Mendip. Remains lost in blitz. No account has appeared in print of the work carried out by Mr. R.F. Read.
