T I M B E R .

The Society is given permission to cut birchwood, and birchwood only, for use directly by the Society, in the wood to the North of the Society's Hut.

The trees must be cut close to the ground and the brushwood properly collected and taken back to camp to be burned.

Ash and other trees must not be cut, and proper care must be taken to avoid damage to other trees when felling birch.

The increasing scarcity of timber has made birch a valuable wood for various purposes. Hence ~~the~~ reasonable economy in the use of firewood should be exercised. The smaller and mishapen trees should be ~~used~~ selected for felling.

The Society shall confine its activities to the area east of the ruined wall which divides the land in a roughly North-South direction to the West of the Hut and to the East of the New Plantation.

The Society shall not interfere with the rights of the tenants of the land nor permit the privileges granted to be abused.

HUT LEVY:

The hut levy must be paid by each person using the hut or its facilities. The levy is 6d. per day and 6d. per night or parts thereof; the maximum per visit being 5/-.

The hut levy goes to ~~pay~~ pay for :- gas, and its installation, paraffin, candles, lamp glasses, cooking utensils etc. etc.

The Hut Fund does not pay for milk or any other form of food or drink. Food must be brought to the hut on each and every visit to maintain an ~~adequate~~ adequate stock of food.

BURRINGTON FIELD HEAD-QUARTERS CAMP RULES.

1. Parties visiting caves shall leave a note in a prominent position in the hut stating the cave visited, number in the party, time of departure and expected time of return and date. On return, the note should be erased or crossed out to signify safe return of the party.
2. The log book must be written up after each trip by the senior member of the party. All work must be recorded and the recorder must sign his name. This is important as the camp log is the basic reference for the work of the Society.
3. After each camp, the fire must be properly extinguished ~~the~~ the wood-bunkers refilled and the hut swept.
4. Food must be stored in the proper receptacles only.
5. Waste materials must be removed from the hut to the appropriate pit. Empty tins should be thrown on the fire to burn waste food and before being thrown onto the pit should be flattened.
6. Blankets must be aired after use if the weather is not inclement; and should be folded and neatly piled up before returning to Bristol.
7. The hut must be properly bolted and shuttered. The last person to leave will be held responsible in the event of loss or damage due to the neglect of these precautions.
8. Members who invite guests to the hut are responsible for their conduct and must not leave other people to look after them.
9. This log book must be preserved. Its pages shall not be removed, destroyed or defaced.


Tues Oct. 20th







The cave is about the ~~size~~ ^{extent} of Eastwater, as regards length & depth, but then as ~~are~~ ^{are} so many more passages, ~~amounting~~ ^{amounting} to about 2000 feet. Most of these are high rifts, dipping with the bedding, and so many verticals have to be climbed with tackle. A very useful line is called a "knobby dog", and looks like this:



The cross pieces of metal or wire give a good hand hold for awkward pitches. The cave is very muddy. The entrance pitch of about 25 feet is a very narrow rift, worse than Longwood, and is very wet. The other pitches are easy. Many of the rifts are partly blocked by enormous boulders, and here the mud is drier, and some beautiful formations, mostly calcareous, may be seen. There is a phreatic maze near the bottom, like the Black Hole series in Swildons, called the Rabbit Warren. There are two mounds to the main streamway, the first can be by-passed, the second is final (at present). All the pitches except the first are kept laddered by the B.E.C. who charge a tackle fee for visitors of 1/-.

Exploration has been the main activity of the B.E.C. in this cave; surveying has hardly been started. While they are to be congratulated on their fortitude in pursuing these tasks, the arduous nature of the cave as a whole makes it rather a collector's piece for others.



Bertie did not fancy his chances of getting down (or up) the entrance pitch and O.C. was going to have to masquerade as a DOCTOR in his place. So I went there with Treaty at about 7 am. and found the M.P. there in force: Luke Derrin & Harold Kinnay. David Willis was down with a mixed party of Werron & B.E.C. getting the lad out. He was reported to have broken both ankles and his head. I went down with Harold & two others & found that the party

had already reached the latter base below the heavy drift in the Great Rift. We waited for them to get above this waterfall before doing anything more. Then we sent the water & tender members of the rescue party home & took their place. We put warm clothes on the victim & I had a look at his injuries. He had not broken anything. He had a painful bruise on the dorsum of his right foot and a large bruise on his left shin with a haematoma. Also a bad bruise above the left temple with slight laceration. The right foot had already been efficiently bandaged & so had his head, so I did everything up again, saw that he did as much work for himself as possible, so as to keep warm, & we went on. David Willis had already done very good work getting him so far and he continued doing so to the end. He deserves great praise for all this. He was by far the best man for the job & he did it admirably. The party was out by about 10 am.

One of the skeletons is of an immature individual, this is rather against the cemetery being that of a religious house. S.W. & E.K.T. did levelling.





Saturday 23rd April

The Secretary & Blair Hoyt went to Swildon's to join Blair Wells & a Women's Party for an exploratory trip in "Paradise Regained." This is a new set of passages in the St. Paul's Series, as long again as those already known & much larger, discovered in mid-March 1955 by forcing (blowing at) the muddy ramp in the Lower Fault

Passage. This is the Passage where the mud stalagmites in the Society's Museum come from. Several hours baling were then necessary to get a 6" air space, and some 200' of passage were then bailed.

This time only little baling was necessary. One can go through the muddy muck on one's back, head first, protected by a waterproof hood, and then pass the hats & luggage through afterwards. It is the filthiest hole I have ever been through. The mud is of a singularly adhesive character and gritty.

We wrought some 300' more passage, bringing the total to about 800', not counting laterals, of which there are many, & of which some that need climbing have yet to be explored. The general character of the series is quite unlike Suidan's & more like St. Gilbert's (high rifts, mud, boulders) but without any formations, & with hardly any water. You have to take water with you. The 250' or so past the muddy muck is a huge boulder pile at a cross rift, with a boulder patch of about 35' (all it 40', as it is in Suidan's). We dove in a sandbolt for a tether here & it was descended for the first time. Only disappointment at the bottom.

Strom & I returned a little in advance of the others, & are fairly of the opinion that Paradise was by no means regained until we were back through that muck: if true. Total time 9 hours ^{underground}. Returned at daybreak. Part of party delayed, not seen at Paddy.





I have found similar worms at the foot of Jack's Ladder in Swilcher's. Main streamway in master-cave also contains shrimps, but not so easy to find, also flood pools at the side. I only found one Asellus, and that was in a gurg pool 3' up on the right, about 100' below the foot of the fault chamber. It was a very large one. Took this & several shrimps.
