Concerning The Sinking of Two Immense Holes On The Flank of  
Blackdown Hill, Somerset

(i) The first of these holes was sunk in the bottom of the bomb crater nearest the cheddar path. On the angle of the <sup>first</sup> change of slope. The depth of the bomb crater was about 8' on the down slope side and 12 feet ~~of~~ on the up slope side. The hole was sunk to a depth of three feet in the bottom of this, tunnelling all the way through a stratum of O.A.S. angular boulders and pebbles mixed with good quality soil. This deposit gave every sign of being water permeable. The depth of this deposit is still unknown but it seems possible that it might extend to the depth of the fairly level ground before the hut.

(ii) This was sunk in the very angle of its first change of slope at the very head of the bath stream. It was sunk to a depth of ~~three~~ <sup>two</sup> feet on the down slope side and ten feet on the up slope. The depth was limited by flooding. One could discern that if proper drainage channels were constructed the hole could be sunk to a depth of six feet, in the course of a days work.

The upper part on the upslope sides and <sup>the</sup> ~~the~~ <sup>of</sup> whole, its down slope sides deposit was good quality brown soil (see end of paper) but below this on the upslope side was the same deposit as was encountered in the other hole. From this ~~the~~ deposit

flowed a ~~copious~~ copious trickle of water of such volume that the hole could not be bailed fast enough. It would seem that although this boulder deposit is permeable and could well be the supplier of the bath stream, the water might still come from a spring in the O.R.S. and the flow through the boulder ~~rock~~ deposit. This possibility is in accordance with the observation that the whole of the relatively flat area before the hut is marshy only where a stream flows and not over the whole area. This work was done on a day when there had been no rain for a week, and the ground was frozen for the first inch below the surface.

We must give our thanks to Mr. N. J. Wallace for digging the holes with great speed and accuracy for a fee of 1/2p. Mr. C. J. Eaton contributed but little in the way of bodily effort to the venture.





and contains the biggest of about a depth of one foot. The east side floor is of fallen roof boulders and sizes about 15 feet.
