A Bibliography of the Palæolithic and Pleistocene Sites of the Mendip, Bath and Bristol Area First Supplement

The present contribution is a continuation of the bibliography compiled by the writer and published in these *Proceedings* in 1954. About 45 of the 106 additional items are references, mostly very minor ones, which were omitted from the 1954 bibliography and have come to my notice since. The remaining 61 are new and mark a welcome renewal of interest in the Pleistocene of our area. Among the landmarks are the publication of new maps of the area by both the Geological Survey (item 221) and the Soil Survey (items 200, 201). In addition to papers by local workers, many of them members of our Society, there are a number by experts from elsewhere, notably the first reports of a timely re-examination of some of our late Palæolithic sites by Dr. McBurney of Cambridge (items 240, 241). New sites for excavation, although not as easy to come by as formerly, are happily still forthcoming, and a full report on Picken's Hole (item 269) will be eagerly awaited.

The scope of the bibliography and the area which it covers are the same as for its predecessor of 1954. The items are numbered consecutively with those of the 1954 list, and a new site index is included, incorporating the one previously published and also the new references.
