Caving

Since our term of office starts in March, the first major trip that concerns us is the Easter weekend in Yorkshire, this being attended by our hard core of cavers who, as in previous years, camped at Clapham. The summer saw another OCL trip to Ireland, where our work on the caves of the area was furthered, and a trip to Greece. However, the Greece trip saw few finds of any importance.
