Report for the Twelve Months ending December, 1924.

During the past year the Society's activities have proceeded steadily and successfully. The New Year, Easter and Summer Camps at Burrington, and the Sessional meetings have all been well attended; brief notes on the latter appear at the end of this number.

We have been very fortunate in discovering a skull in the Oxford University Museum, which was taken from Aveline's Hole, Burrington, by Dean Buckland. We are deeply indebted to Mr. L. H. Dudley Buxton for his report on this and some other skulls.

A noteworthy feature of the past year's work was the expedition to the Wye Valley; in spite of bad weather, very successful excavations were carried out.
