Curator's Report for 1925.

The Society still suffers from lack of museum space; necessitating the removal of the general stone implement collection to the lobby outside the museum.

The Society has been, for some time, attempting to form an Index Collection for student use, especially for new members of the Society, which will enable them to examine actual specimens of the various archæological cultures. It is to this end that efforts are being directed in the arrangement of the collection. The sequence of cultures is but poorly represented in the Lower Palæolithic, Neolithic and Halstatt stages. This is not entirely the fault of the Society, as there seems to be a dearth of material representing those particular phases in this locality.
