

## A Celtic Weaving Comb from Bristol

A year or so ago a piece of worked bone was dug up in the neighbourhood of Baldwin Street. It is evidently the greater part of a weaving comb of the Early Iron Age type, like those found in the Lake Villages and Wookey Hole. It is ornamented with incised concentric circles and circular pierced holes and is  $4\frac{1}{2}$  inches long. This find, kindly communicated to the Society by Mr. Frederick C. Jones, adds another site to those at which artefacts belonging to this period have been found before in Bristol, namely, at the Pithay, and under the General Post Office in Small Street.
