
A Bone Point from Brean Down

ago, and found a bone point made from a metatarsal bone. Its length is $3\frac{1}{10}''$ and it has a fine polish as though it had been much used. It resembles the bone points from the ditch at Gorsey Bigbury in the Society's Museum.
