

**Note on a Barrow in the Parish of Newington
Bagpath, Gloucestershire, Sheet LVII, S.W.**

On March 3, 1934, an unrecorded round barrow in the above parish was brought to my notice by a farmer. It was situated a short distance south-east of the Bagpath Burial Circle (T. 53) described in U.B.S.S. *Proceedings*, No. 3, Vol. 2.

The situation of the new barrow is atypical for the Cotswolds, being on a flattish ledge of ground on the side of a valley. It is roughly 40 feet in diameter and 4 feet high. One large stone about 5 feet 6 inches long lies prostrate on the slope of the barrow, near the centre, and 6 yards away are two smaller slabs set edgewise, and at right-angles to each other. There is no trace of a ditch. The whole barrow is so thickly overgrown with thorn bushes that further investigation at the time was impossible, and there has been no subsequent opportunity for examination.

Both this barrow and the Burial Circle are of quite unusual type in the Cotswolds.
